Position statement

This position relates to and should be read in conjunction with the *Government Information Licensing Framework (GILF) QGEA policy*.

Ref #	Target	Compliance date
1	Department policies incorporate GILF.	By 30 September 2010
2	Departmental websites updated to include GILF licence/s covering all new content and copyright clarity for existing material.	By 31 March 2011
3	All newly released Government information is licensed with one of the GILF licences.	By 31 March 2011
4	Existing information generated electronically (on demand) and released by the Department is licensed with a GILF licence.	By 31 March 2012

These targets apply to all departments in the scope of the related QGEA policy. If a department believes that a target is not applicable to their context, or delivery constraints means the deadline for the target cannot be met, they may apply for an exception to the target.

Reporting requirements

Departments at a minimum must report in a format prescribed by QGCIO on:

- the manner in which the GILF policy has been integrated into departmental policies
- compliance of department websites to GILF policy requirements
- what government information is released by the Department on a licence other than one of the six Creative Commons licence (for example a restrictive licence).

Issue and review

This QGEA position paper is published within the QGEA and is administered by the Queensland Government Chief Information Office. It was approved by the Queensland Government Chief Information Officer on 12 March 2010.

This QGEA position paper will be reviewed on an annual basis. The next review date is March 2011.
